The author of the article “Cesarean Delivery and Its Impact on the Anomalous Infant,” which appears in the June 2008 issue of *Clinics in Perinatology* (Volume 35, Issue 2), would like to amend the paragraph on page 402 under the heading “Hydrops.” The paragraph should read:

Fetal hydrops results from a variety of causes in addition to the aforementioned masses, including congenital heart disease or arrhythmias, twin-twin transfusion, chromosomal abnormalities, hematologic abnormalities (immune and nonimmune anemia), congenital viral infections, and congenital chylothorax [64]. The literature on mode of delivery for fetal hydrops is insufficient to recommend one mode of delivery over the other, though in certain cases, cesarean delivery may avoid abdominal dystocia and reduce trauma to edematous and friable fetal tissues. Interventions should be individualized to the specific situation.
